

EDF Energy Birmingham Half Marathon 2010 Official Route

The proposed route for the EDF Energy Birmingham Half Marathon will start on Cambridge Street near Paradise Forum and finish on Broad Street next to Centenary Square. The route takes in some famous Birmingham landmarks.

Birmingham Library
Adjacent to the starting line is the site of the new Library of Birmingham. The library will be a centre for learning incorporating a theatre, a café, photo and news archive and the very latest in technology.

Brindleyplace
An award winning canal side development, Brindleyplace is a leisure and business destination which includes bars, restaurants, galleries and a theatre. The Water's Edge area of Brindleyplace first opened in 1994 and up to two million people pass through the development every year.

International Convention Centre
Situated in the heart of Birmingham, the ICC has staged some of the largest and most prestigious conferences and events in the world including the G8 summit of world leaders in 1998.

Originally opened in 1834, Birmingham's Town Hall underwent a refurbishment and reopened in 2007. The Town Hall is located in Victoria Square which was opened by the Princess of Wales following its own refurbishment in 1993.

For over a century Edgbaston has been hosting first class cricket. The home of Warwickshire County Cricket Club, Edgbaston is a regular venue for England test matches.






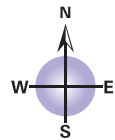
Cannon Hill Park
